Telluride: Unmatched in North America

On January 17th, led by Bob Ansel, 27 members of the club found their way to Telluride, Colorado, to join 325 others from the Flatland Ski Association!

Once again, an excited group of 27 St. Louis Ski Club loyalists departed Lambert Field for Telluride, Colorado, at the crack of dawn on January 17th. The group was eager to hit the mountain and to partake in the festivities of the 51st Annual Flatland Ski Association (FSA) Race Event. After a foggy, unexpected 3 hour layover in Denver, collectively we weighed down a prop-job plane and made our way to Montrose, Colorado, where our over-stuffed shuttle whisked us off to The Peaks Hotel located in Mountain Village for six days of glorious snow, sun and fun.

On day one, what better welcome than full service ski valet right outside the hotel! A few of us took the mountain tour, hosted by none other than "Sled Tater" (aka Ted), who arrived in Telluride in 1973 and hasn't really left since! He showed off all the best parts of the mountain, eagerly telling stories and providing his 'own' versions of Telluride history of the area. Hmm, how accurate was he?

That evening, the gang piled into Bob and Arthur's room for the club pizza/welcoming party. Wow, there sure was plenty of pie to go around! But somehow we ran out of wine and beer. Go figure! Ahhh ... morning came, and we all settled into the week's indulgence of skiing, with fresh snow a few nights and days filled with sunshine, perfect temperatures and all-round great skiing.

Bev Doolin took a detour off the mountain after one shaky night! The Peaks were more than gracious, acting as her personal chauffeur to and from the Telluride Medical Center, only to find the diagnosis of pneumonia! The best part....we had some big wins this year, and the primary reason our club ranked! Medalists were:

Joe needs to draw better next year ... not dead last!) Our own Bill Hayes, who was more than deserving, was presented the Judy Award for his dedication and spirit of promoting ski racing. Bill Hayes Receives Special Award!

The Flatland Ski Association (FSA) has awarded the **Judy Cup** at the FSA Ski Week every year since 1990. It is presented to persons who have made exemplary contributions to FSA, demonstrating service and/or sportsmanship in the Flatlands' tradition. The recipient is selected by the FSA Board, and this year's unanimous winner was our own **Bill Hayes**.

A member of the St. Louis Ski Club, Judy Nania was a true Flatlander, full of the racing spirit. She was a behind the scenes worker and promoter of the races. Oh, how she loved the races. Judy passed away on December 2, 1989 after a valiant battle with cancer.

Judy is not gone from the Flatlands. Her memory is preserved by a loving cup awarded each year to an outstanding individual who exhibits her drive and dedication. This beautiful trophy is provided each year by Judy's husband, Vince Nania, of the St. Louis Ski Club.

The St. Louis Ski Club has been a part of the Flatland Ski Association (FSA) since 1966 ... but how much do you really know about the FSA and who's part of it?


The FSA races began March 21, 1965 in Crested Butte, Colorado. The Kansas City Ski Club originated and hosted the first event, and it took two years of challenges before others accepted. The first year it was clubs from Kansas City, Omaha, Amarillo, and Wichita. St. Louis joined the second year and participated regularly through 1982, then was "in and out" for a number of years following that. But we've been regularly participating in FSA events for the past 10 years!

The first year there were 40 racers, and this year there were approximately 350 people who came to the event, most of whom participated in at least one of the races. There have been as many as 12 clubs in the FSA over the years, but in recent years it's been 9 core clubs from the Midwest: St. Louis, Columbia (MO), Kansas City, Topeka, Wichita, Lincoln (NE), Omaha, Oklahoma City, and Tulsa. Each club has a volunteer who sits on the FSA board, and all of the FSA officers are also volunteers. They put in countless hours of planning for the events each year just because they enjoy the fellowship and the racing! (Bragging rights in some cases, too, but all in fun!) In recent years Candy Girth has served as the FSA Activities Director and Bill Hayes as the FSA Race Director, coordinating those events for all the clubs. Candy Girth and Paul Snyder have both served as the St. Louis FSA representative for the past few years. Paul served as the national Vice President of the FSA last year, and will begin his term as president in June. Candy Girth was just elected secretary, and will also begin serving her term this coming June.

The races *are* the main reason for this annual event, and this year was the 52nd year of racing! There are challenge races for men and women (*by age brackets*), an "open" race that anyone can pay to participate in, and a novice race for those who haven't competed in the challenge races in the past or haven't won Nastar or other medals in the past. We had three club members do this in January! There's also normally a "team" event, which for the past several years has been a snowshoe relay race. It is one of the most entertaining things to watch! And every year the individual club Race Directors have a "fun race" and sell tickets to raise money for the charity the FSA adopts each year. In 2016 it was Telluride Adaptive Sports. This year SLSC members Bill and Judy Hayes and Dan Rath won in their challenge races, and Joe Bauer represented the club as our Race Director in the "fun" race!

The FSA also give out other awards, besides just the race winners. The **Dave Vannett Race Director's Cup** is presented by the club race directors to whomever they feel has made a significant achievement in racing. Sometimes an individual, and sometimes a club.

Another award presented is the **Judy Cup**, named after a true Flatlander, Judy Nania of the St. Louis Ski Club. After her death in 1989, her husband Vince honored her memory with this award. Each year this beautiful cup is presented by the FSA Board to an individual who has made exemplary contributions to the FSA, demonstrating service and sportsmanship in the true FSA spirit!
